Report of the Academic Audit 2021-2022

Nistarini College Purulia The Principal, **Nistarini College, Purulia**, applied to the Inspector of Colleges of the Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University vide letter No.10P/NC.23 dated 13.01.2023 for conducting an Academic Audit in the College. Accordingly, by the order of the Honourable Vice Chancellor, the Academic Audit Team of the Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University, Purulia has conducted the Academic Audit in the college on 2nd February, 2023. The said audit is based on the data and information supplied by the college authority for the period concerned till the date of audit. The item-wise observations and remarks of the Audit Team are given below:

1.0 Introduction

NISTARINI COLLEGE is located in the district of PURULIA and was established in 1957. The genesis of NISTARINI (WOMEN'S) COLLEGE, one of the premier academic institutes in the State of West Bengal is intimately entwined with the cause of women's education. The institution was first conceptualized in the Summer House of Deshbandhu Chittaranjan Das—whose family had significantly fostered women's education in Bengal and was an integral part of the national freedom struggle.

Sri Bhuban Mohan Das and Smt. Nistarini Devi, father and mother of Sri Chittaranjan Das came to reside in this house in the year 1902. Both of them were dedicated social workers and pioneered in introducing higher education among the women folk of this place. Amala Devi, their daughter started a school to impart higher education to the girls of Purulia. At that time, there was only one lower Primary School, which was known as NISTARINI VIDYALAYA of which Deshbandhu Sri Chittaranjan Das defrayed the entire expenses. A number of the lady teaching staff was brought in to educate girls on all fronts literary, musical and artistic. An orphanage and widows' home were run under the guidance and supervision of Amala Devi. Soon it became a centre of culture for the people of Purulia. Unfortunately, the demise of all the three, Sri Bhuban Mohan Das, Smt. Nistarini Devi and Amala Devi within a short span of time led to the temporary closure of this institutions. Sometime after, Shrimati Basanti Devi, Chittaranjan's wife came to reside here and the tradition of the house was again revived. This time they paid special attention to educate the Harijan children living in the neighbourhood. They, along with their parents, were also encouraged to attend religious ceremonies regularly in this house. When Sri Chiraranjan Das, son of Deshbandhu Chittaranjan Das, fell seriously ill, the then Chief Minister Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy came to attend him and was impressed by the 'Sankirtan' assemblage of Harijans in this house. As a result of the Chief Minister's own initiatives and the request of the eminent leaders and social workers of this district (Sri Jimut Bahan Sen et al) an educational institution for women was set up. Thus, the Summer House of the family was converted into Nistarini (Women's) College.

2.0 Executive Summary

The college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta during 1957-1960, thereafter it was affiliated to the University of Burdwan during 1960-2010, afterwards Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University since 2011. The college is State Aided General Degree College having 2(f) & 12(B) of UGC Act. The motto of this institute is to equip the students with professional efficiency and social competencies by providing latest teaching technology, teaching



pedagogies, use of ICT, etc. The college is projected to create and disseminate knowledge as per the vision and mission of the college. Presently the intake capacity is 2343 in UG courses and 40 in PG (MA. in Bengali). The college was first accredited by NAAC with Grade "B++" in 2004; and Second accreditation was held with Grade "A (3.13)" in 2016. The College has one playground and a lush green garden containing old and primitive plants, sprawling over a vast expanse of land inside the campus. There are three Girls Hostel inside the College campus with 274 boarders with warden, kitchen, dining hall, cook, common room and other facilities.

Teachers are used to distribute proper teaching plan well in advance and follow the academic calendar as per the university. Teaching learning methods are participative, experiential and community based. Proper pedagogy, teaching aids and mentor-mentee systems are practiced which have been revealed by the consistent good academic results. Students are internally assessed by teachers through continuous process. Student, teacher, other staff members and the Principal along with the Governing body shouldered collective responsibility in order to achieve all round development of the college. Outreach and sport activities of the college are praiseworthy.

3.0 Significant Observations

- 1. College has a very good reputation and track records in imparting higher education in various science and arts subjects. The long tradition & heritage of the college, strict discipline of the college plays important role to instil value based education, ethics and other cocurricular activities.
- 2. College has formed the IQAC which is active and organize various events.
- 3. College has adopted some best practices like regular institutional supports for faculty development, Jal Shakti Abhiyan, Yoga programme, Community outreach programme through NSS unit in Campus.
- College has taken initiative to install the solar panels.
- 5. College is maintaining the disposal of all sorts of wastes.
- 6. All teaching and non-teaching staff members, students are advised to use recyclable materials for storing their food, water etc., to reduce the wastes.
- 7. College is conducting some environmental awareness programs, taking initiative in making bird-nests on some trees in the campus.

However, after detailed paper examinations and physical verification it is noted that, some of the practices are required to be followed by the College and there are scope of improvements in some areas that detailed in the suggestion section.

4.0 Statement of Assurance

As far as possible, appropriate audit procedures has been completed with evidence gathered to support the accuracy of the conclusions reached unanimously by all members of the audit team and contained in this report. The conclusions are based on a comparison of the situations as those exist at the time of the audit with established and functional units.
